Resurvey of the North Boundary of T. 32 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. of sec. 35, T. 31 S., R. 9 W. only, with brass cap mkd.

$\frac{1}{4}$  S 35

1917 from which

A maple, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 25° E., 41 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S35 BT. (New B. T.)

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 62° W., 48 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S35 BT. (Old B. T.)

Thence S. 87° 24' W., continuing my measurements.

67.00 Begin descent of steep NW. slope.

71.90 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course NE.; ascend.

78.04 Intersect the old cor. of secs. 2 and 3, which is a sugar pine tree, 72 ins. diam., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, except that the SE., SW. and NW. bearing trees are now dead. I change this cor. to an angle point, destroying all marks on the cor. and marking AP on N. side, from which

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 70° E., 58 lks. dist., marked AP BT. (Old B. T.)

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 74° W., 31 lks. dist., marked AP BT. (New B. T.)

Thence N. 89° 14' W., continuing my measurements.

80.02 (80.00 chs. departure.)

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 2 and 3, with brass cap marked

1917 from which

A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears S. 82° E., 70 lks. dist., marked T32S R9W S2 BT.

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 39° W., 29 lks. dist., marked T32S R9W S3 BT.

Land, mountainous. Soil, stony clay loam, shale and solid rock, 3rd and 4th rate. Timber, fir and sugar pine. Undergrowth, live oak, vine maple, tan oak, huckleberry and young fir.

N. 89° 14' W., resurveying N. bdy. of sec. 3.

Ascend gradual E. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

1.00 Ravine, course SE.

14.25 Leave timber, bears N. and S.; enter old burn.

21.28 Intersect the cor. of secs. 34 and 35, which is a chinquapin tree, 5 ins. diam., killed by fire, fallen and partly burned; both bearing trees have been destroyed by fire. I perpetuate this cor., as follows: alongside the stump of the old cor. tree,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 34 and 35, T. 31 S., R. 9 W. only, with brass cap marked
