T.)</p> <p>Thence S. 89° 52' W., continuing my measurements</p> <p>34.86 The point for old <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor., located by reference to the NE. bearing tree as described by the surveyor general, bears South, 2 lks. dist.; all other traces of the cor. have disappeared.
