

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines, T. 28 N., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

Land, rolling hills except for approximately 10 chs. of bottom land S. of the S 1/16 sec. cor. Soil, clay and sandy loam. Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, oak, chinquapin, dogwood and ash; undergrowth, vinemaple, blackberry, fern, arrowwood, hazel, poison oak and Oregon grape.

From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 22 and 27, perpetuated and recorded by H. L. Eppstein, C.S., in 1935, at record distance from the original SW. bearing tree, monumented with a steering column, firmly set 6 ins. above ground, from which the original tree:

A sawed fir stump, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 73 1/4° W., 42 lks. dist., with scribe mark S visible on bark blaze. (Record bearing S. 78° W.)

bearing tree by Eppstein, in 1935:

A cedar, 23 ins. diam., bears S. 36 3/4° E., 59 lks. dist., with scribe marks S2 CS visible on partially healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which bearing trees:

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 61 1/4° W., 134 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S22 BT.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 21 1/4° W., 146 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S27 BT.

Reset steering column alongside iron post.

The cor. falls in small swampy area:

S. 89° 09' W., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 153 ft. over SE. slope, through logged area and scattering timber and undergrowth.

- 5.20 Abandoned dirt access road, 12 lks. wide, bears NW. and SE. curving south.
- 12.54 Spur, slopes S.; descend 37 ft. over SW. slope.
- 16.38 Ravine, drains S.; ascend 14 ft. over SE. slope.
- 18.22 Ridge, divide between Lee Creek and North Myrtle Creek drainages, bears NE. and SW.; descend 23 ft. over NW. slope.
- 19.71 Point for the W 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 22 and 27.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A chinquapin, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 67 3/4° E., 32 lks. dist., marked W 1/16 S 22 BT.
