

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

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Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 25 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

 $\frac{1}{4}$  S13 BT.

A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears S.  $39\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W., 12 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S14 BT.

41.45 Norris Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N.  $20^{\circ}$  E.; ascend 129 ft. over SE. slope, through logged area.

42.24 Maintained dirt access road, 20 lks. wide, bears NE. and SW.

52.24 Spur, slopes E.; descend 50 ft. over NE. slope.

54.76 Ravine, course E.; ascend 7 ft. along E. slope.

56.80 Abandoned skid road, 20 lks. wide, bears E. and W.

61.00 Ravine, course E.; ascend 115 ft. over S. slope.

64.22 Abandoned skid road, 20 lks. wide, bears NW. and SE.

69.48 Spur, slopes SE.; descend 132 ft. over N. slope.

77.28 Ravine, course S.  $30^{\circ}$  E.; ascend 43 ft. over S. slope.

83.60 The cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14, perpetuated and recorded by B. Irving, in 1929, from the original NE. and NW. bearing trees, which are no longer in existence, with a cedar post, 4 ins. cross section, 4 ft. above ground, firmly set, with scribe marks T25S S12 on NE., S13 on SE., S14 on SW., and R4W S11 on NW. face, from which local bearing trees:

A fir stump, 30 ins. diam., bears N.  $77^{\circ} 45'$  E., 65 lks. dist., marked with a healed blaze.

A fir stump, 26 ins. diam., bears S.  $47^{\circ}$  E., 48 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on open blaze.

A fir, stump, 24 ins. diam., bears N.  $45^{\circ} 45'$  W., 53 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on open blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A cedar, 15 ins. diam., bears N.  $16^{\circ}$  E., 107 lks. dist., marked T25S R4W S12 BT.

A cedar, 11 ins. diam., bears S.  $50^{\circ}$  E., 212 lks. dist., marked T25S R4W S13 BT.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.  $65^{\circ}$  W., 212 lks. dist., marked T25S R4W S14 BT.

A maple, 13 ins. diam., bears N.  $67^{\circ}$  W., 63 lks. dist., marked T25S R4W S11 BT.

Reset the cedar post alongside the iron post.

Land, mountainous. Soil, clay and loam. Timber, fir, cedar, maple, dogwood, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, vinemaple, hazel, poison oak and ocean spray.
