Remonumentation of the Corner of Sections 10, 11, 14 and 15, T. 19 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. $16\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 52 lks. dist., marked T19S R8W S11 BT.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. $61^{\circ} 45'$ W., 71 lks. dist., marked T19S R8W S15 BT.

A fir, 29 ins. diam., bears N. 86° W., 60 lks. dist., marked T19S R8W S10 BT.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Section 23, township 19 south, range 8 west, lies within the drainage area of the Siuslaw River in the Coast Range Mountains. The section is drained by Mill Creek and Collins Creek, both of which flow in a northeasterly direction to the Siuslaw River. These streams are reasonably free from brush and can be used as trails to provide access into the section. Elevation above sea level ranges from about 400 feet in the bottom land at the northeast corner of the section, which is 5 chains west of the Siuslaw River, to approximately 1,150 feet at the southeast corner of the section.

The soil in this area is sandy clay loam from a few inches to several feet in depth overlying sandstone bedrock, which is exposed in occasional outcroppings. Timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, cascara, madrone, and scattering yew, with undergrowth of vine maple, salmonberry, red huckleberry, hazel, young conifers, arrowwood, salal, sword fern, bracken, and poison oak.
