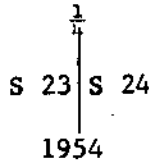
Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 23 and 24, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

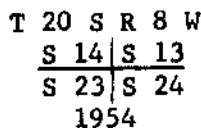
A fir, 65 ins. diam., bears N.  $23\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E., 83 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S24 BT.

A fir, 45 ins. diam., bears N.  $21\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  W., 106 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S23 BT.

Descend 20 ft. over N. slope.

- 39.42 Draw, drains N.  $80^{\circ}$  W.; asc. 328 ft. over SW. slope.
- 50.96 Ridge, bears N.  $30^{\circ}$  W. and S.  $40^{\circ}$  E.; desc. 419 ft. over NE. slope.
- 61.67 Draw, drains S.  $85^{\circ}$  E.; asc. 158 ft. over SE. slope.
- 65.44 Spur, slopes S.  $75^{\circ}$  E.; desc. 347 ft. over NE. slope.
- 75.14 Draw, drains S.  $85^{\circ}$  E.; asc. 41 ft. over SE. slope.
- 76.20 Point for the cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 12 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, to top, with brass cap marked

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears N.  $51^{\circ}$  E., 81 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S13 BT.

A maple, 25 ins. diam., bears S.  $45\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E., 83 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S24 BT.

A maple, 30 ins. diam., bears S.  $73^{\circ}$  W., 22 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S23 BT.

A maple, 23 ins. diam., bears N.  $27^{\circ}$  W., 34 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S14 BT.

Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, hemlock, maple, cedar, alder, chinquapin, dogwood, madrona, and cascara. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, huckleberry, slickleaf, arrowwood, and salal.

From the cor. of secs. 13 and 24, on the E. bdy. of the Tp.

N.  $84^{\circ} 06'$  W., bet. secs. 13 and 24.
