

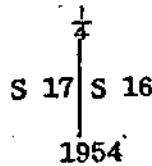
County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

- 12.55 Top of ascent on W. slope; desc. 70 ft. over NW. slope.
- 20.30 South Sister Creek, 40 lks. wide, course N. 80° E. curving to N. 80° W.; asc. 303 ft. over SW. slope.
- 30.15 Spur, slopes S. 80° W.; desc. 108 ft. along W. slope, changing to N. slope.
- 36.10 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course N. 20° W.; asc. 26 ft. over SW. slope.
- 38.00 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 49 ft. over NW. slope.
- 39.70 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 16 and 17, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked



from which

A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S. 54° E., 39 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S16 BT.

A fir, 55 ins. diam., bears S. 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 62 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S17 BT.

Descend 17 ft. over NW. slope.

- 40.30 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course S. 80° W.; asc. 397 ft. over SW. slope.
- 58.40 Ridge, bears N. 70° W. and S. 70° E.; desc. 320 ft. over NW. slope.
- 66.00 Ravine, drains NE.; asc. 69 ft. over SE. slope.
- 69.80 Top of ascent on E. slope; desc. 283 ft. over NE. slope.
- 77.35 North Sister Creek, 15 lks. wide, course S. 75° W.; asc. 6 ft. over S. slope.
- 79.40 The cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17, determined at record bearing from the original bearing trees:

A rotted maple stump, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 70° E., 34 lks. dist., with no marks remaining. (Record distance, 32 lks.)

A fir snag, 86 lks. diam., bears S. 47° E., 68 lks. dist., with traces of marks remaining on bark. (Record distance, 56 lks.)

A maple, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 61° W., 53 lks. dist., marked with a healed blaze. (Record distance, 49 lks.)

A fir snag, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 23° W., 41 lks. dist., with traces of marks remaining on bark. (Record distance, 40 lks.)

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked
