

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS	
14.65	Same trail, bears NW. and SE.
15.15	North Sister Creek, 30 lks. wide, course N. 10° W.; desc. slightly across bottom.
16.75	Same creek, 30 lks. wide, course SW.; asc. slightly across bottom.
18.40	Branch, 5 lks. wide, course SW.; asc. slightly across bottom.
20.00	Edge of bottom, bears NE. and SW.; asc. .30 ft. over SE. slope, changing to S. slope.
22.80	Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 15 ft. over SW. slope.
23.80	Branch, 1 lk. wide, course S. 40° E.; asc. 20 ft. over SE. slope.
24.50	Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 50 ft. SW. slope.
27.00	Enter bottom, bears NW. and SE.; desc. slightly.
28.40	Same trail, bears NW. and SE.
30.00	Branch, 1 lk. wide, course SW.; 30 lks. upstream from mouth; desc. slightly.
32.50	Right bank of North Sister Creek, course NW. curving to W.; desc. slightly along creek.
35.30	Leave creek, course SW.; desc. slightly along edge of creek.
37.50	Leave edge of creek; asc. slightly along S. slope.
41.04	The cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17.
	Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, hemlock, maple, cedar, alder, chinquapin, dogwood, madrona, and cascara. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, huckleberry, slickleaf, arrowwood, and salal.
	N. 0° 13' E., bet. secs. 8 and 9.
	Ascend slightly over S. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
0.20	Trail, bears N. 70° E. and S. 80° W.
1.30	Edge of bottom, bears E. and W.; asc. 330 ft. over S. slope, changing to SW. slope.
19.63	Spur, slopes W.; desc. 315 ft. over NW. slope.
32.05	Edge of bottom land, bears NE. and SW.; desc. 5 ft. over bottom.
32.57	Unimproved road, bears N. 40° E. and S. 55° W.; asc. 23 ft. over SE. slope.
34.08	Branch, 5 lks. wide, course S. 30½° W.; asc. 59 ft. SE. slope.
39.98	The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 8 and 9, determined at record bearing and distance from the original bearing trees:
	A rotted alder stump, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 86° E., 38 lks. dist., with no remaining marks.
	An alder, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 27° W., 29 lks. dist., with marks ¼ S visible on partly healed blaze.
