

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

from which new bearing trees

A cedar, 13 ins. diam., bears S. $21\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 47 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S8 BT.

A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears N. $34\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 35 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S7 BT.

N. $0^{\circ} 06'$ W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 2 ft. over NW. slope.

0.10 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course W.; asc. 240 ft. over SW. slope.

7.10 Spur, slopes SW.; desc. 156 ft. over NW. slope.

13.05 Dry branch, 3 lks. wide, course SW.; asc. 306 ft. over SW. slope.

22.13 Spur ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 407 ft. over NW. slope.

31.92 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course W.; asc. 188 ft. over S. slope.

38.28 The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8, determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining original bearing trees:

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 58° E., 44 lks. dist., marked BT S5 T20S R8W on bark.

A fir, 33 ins. diam., bears S. 80° E., 12 lks. dist., marked with a healed blaze.

A fir, 38 ins. diam., bears S. 60° W., 17 lks. dist., marked with a healed blaze.

The original NW. bearing tree, a fir, 24 ins. diam., is turned out, and lies near-by, with marks BT T20S R8W remaining on bark. (Record, bears N. 18° W., 22 lks. dist.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears S. $49\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 37 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S8 BT.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. $73\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 57 lks. dist., marked T20S R8W S6 BT.

Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, hemlock, maple, cedar, chinquapin, dogwood, madrona and cascara. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, huckleberry slickleaf, arrowwood, and salal.

From the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9.

N. $89^{\circ} 45'$ W., bet. secs. 5 and 8.

Descend 20 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

1.00 Ravine, drains S.; asc. 34 ft. over SE. slope.

3.00 Ridge, bears NE. and SW.; desc. 293 ft. over NW. slope.
