GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The portion of township 27 south, range 3 west, covered by the resurvey, lies about 4 miles southeast of the town of Glide, Oregon, and is drained primarily by Little River, Jim Creek, and Fall Creek. Elevations range from 840 feet above sea level, along Little River in the north portion of section 3, to 2400 feet above sea level in the southwest portion of section 18. Most of the private holdings have been logged with numerous access roads extending throughout the area. The main access is from the paved road which parallels Little River with a number of skidroads, and dirt access roads extending from it. The soil is a rocky clay with a shallow overlay of humus.

The dominant timber species are fir, cedar, hemlock, yew, madrone, maple, white and black oak, and chinquapin. The commoner species of undergrowth are salal, hazel, vinemaple, poison oak, manzanita, madrone, ocean spray, and blackberry.

There were no buildings noted on the public lands and the majority of the private dwellings and improvements are concentrated in the bottom lands of Little River.

There was no evidence of mineral deposits noted with the area covered by the resurvey.

The mean of a number of readings gives a value of 20° 09' E. as the magnetic declination, with a normal range of 3° 40' in local attraction.
