

Dependent Resurvey of the South Boundary of T. 20 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, perpetuated with an iron pipe, 2 ins. diam., 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, with unmarked pipe cap, from which the remaining original bearing trees,

A sawed fir stump, 50 ins. diam., bears S. $71\frac{1}{4}^\circ$ E., 41 lks. dist., with scribe marks weathered away from unhealed blaze. (Thiel record, 41 lks. dist., Gesner, 38 lks. dist.)

A sawed fir stump, 60 ins. diam., bears S. 27° W., 83 lks. dist., with scribe marks weathered away from unhealed blaze. (Thiel record, 80 lks. dist., Gesner, 88 lks. dist.)

A maple, 36 ins. diam., bears N. $66\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ W., 107 lks. dist., with blaze healed. (Thiel record, 101 lks. dist., Gesner, 107 lks. dist.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees,

A maple, 11 ins. diam., bears N. $2\frac{1}{4}^\circ$ E., 156 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S32 BT.

A fir, 33 ins. diam., bears S. $82^\circ 45'$ E., 117 lks. dist., marked T21S R9W S5 BT. (This tree is the anchor for a flood gate in fence across Buck Creek.)

A cedar, 34 ins. diam., bears S. $85\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ W., 88 lks. dist., marked T21S R9W S6 BT.

Reset the iron pipe alongside the iron post.

The sec. cor. is located in a fence row which extends N. $88^\circ 45'$ E. and S. $89^\circ 23'$ W.

Land, mountainous and rolling. Soil, sandy loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, and yew. Undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, hazel, arrowwood, and evergreen huckleberry.

N. $88^\circ 45'$ E., bet. secs. 5 and 32.

Descend 50 ft. over NE. slope, along fence row, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

1.67 Buck Creek, 19 lks. wide, course N. 5° W.; asc. 500 ft. over W. slope.

3.00 Leave fence row, bears N. 85° E. and S. $88^\circ 45'$ W.

16.60 Top of "The Island", a low mountain ridge isolated in former loop of Smith River, bears N. and S. 10° E.; desc. 180 ft. over E. slope.

22.10 Foot of hillside, bears N. and SE.; desc. 40 ft. over bench.

27.00 Edge of bench, bears N. 30° W. and S. 30° E.; desc. 165 ft. over E. slope.

33.30 Little Buck Creek, 4 lks. wide, course N. 40° W.; asc. 20 ft. over bottom land.
