

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the N. Bdy. of T. 20 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

- 30.10 Ravine, course S. 15° W.; asc. 50 ft. over SW. slope.
- 34.80 Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 15 ft. along S. slope.
- 38.10 Spur, slopes S. 40° E.; desc. 30 ft. over E. slope.
- 38.79 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 35, T. 19 S., R. 9 W., marked by an alder, 12 ins. diam., with partial scribe marks visible on partly healed blaze on N. side, from which original bearing trees,
- A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 61° E., 35 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks visible on partly healed blaze.
- An alder stump, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 28° E., 18 lks. dist., with no marks remaining.
- and new bearing trees,
- A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 60 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S35 BT.
- A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N. 21° W., 44 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S35 BT.

- East, beginning new measurement.
- Descend 45 ft. over E. slope.
- 0.89 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 2, marked by the remains of a cascara stump, 6 ins. diam., nearly rotted away, from which the remaining original bearing tree,
- An alder, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 27° E., 12 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT on the bark.
- At the corner point
- Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked
- $\frac{1}{4}$ S 2

- from which new bearing trees,
- A maple, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 19° E., 21 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S2 BT.
- A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S. 69° W., 43 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S2 BT.

- S. 88° 20' E., beginning new measurement.
- Descend 135 ft. over E. slope.
- 3.65 Beaver Creek, 10 lks. wide, in bed, 40 lks. wide, course S.; asc. 40 ft. over W. slope.
- 6.75 Point of spur, slopes SW.; desc. 5 ft. along S. slope.
- 7.45 Branch, 1 lk. wide, flows S. 50° W.; asc. 495 ft. over W. slope; changing to SW. slope.
- 38.52 The cor. of secs. 35 and 36, T. 19 S., R. 9 W., determined from the remaining original bearing tree, as follows:
- A cherry snag, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 82 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 30 lks. dist., plainly blazed and healed.
