Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the N. Bdy. of T. 20 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees,

An alder, 13 ins. diam., bears N.  $4\frac{1}{2}^\circ$  E., 55 lks. dist., marked T19S R9W S36 BT.

A fir, 43 ins. diam., bears N.  $45^\circ$  W., 73 lks. dist., marked T19S R9W S35 BT.

East, beginning new measurement.

Ascend 6 ft. over SW. slope.

0.56 Ridge, bears NW. and SE.; thence along N. slope.

1.36 The cor. of secs. 1 and 2, marked by the rotted remains of a cedar stump, size indeterminate, from which the remaining original bearing trees,

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.  $45^\circ$  E., 14 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks visible on bark blaze. (Record bearing, N.  $57^\circ$  E.)

A chinquapin, 12 ins. diam., bears S.  $37\frac{1}{2}^\circ$  E., 10 lks. dist., with blaze nearly healed.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 8 ins. in the ground to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, to top, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees,

A fir, 35 ins. diam., bears S.  $25^\circ$  E., 70 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S1 BT.

An alder, 12 ins. diam., bears S.  $60^\circ$  W., 28 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S2 BT.

Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin, and madrona. Undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, evergreen huckleberry, red huckleberry, poison oak, hazel, arrowwood, and salal.

S.  $89^\circ 16'$  E., along the N. bdy. of sec. 1.

Along N. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

1.00 Spur, slopes N.  $10^\circ$  E.; desc. 100 ft. over NE. slope.

3.15 Ravine, course N.; asc. 75 ft. along broken N. slope.

8.05 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 140 ft. over broken NE. slope.
