Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the N. Bdy. of T. 20 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

- Ascend 230 ft. over NW. slope, changing to W. slope.
- 11.90 Spur ridge, bears N. 15° W. and S. 15° E.; desc. 30 ft. along N. slope broken by small ravines and spurs.
- 22.80 Ravine, course N.; asc. 315 ft. over NW. slope, changing to W. slope.
- 32.50 Ridge, bears N. 20° E. and S. 10° W.; desc. 170 ft. along S. slope, changing to SE. slope.
- 43.45 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course S. 10° E.; asc. 70 ft. over SW. slope.
- 47.45 Spur, slopes S. 10° E.; desc. 120 ft. over E. slope.
- 51.10 Wet ravine, course S. 40° E.; desc. 40 ft. along broken S. slope.
- 59.06 The closing cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 S., R. 9 W., determined at the record bearing and distance from each of the original bearing trees, as follows:

An uprooted fir, 22 ins. diam., plainly blazed and healed, the stump hole of which bears S. 55½° E., 30 lks. dist.

A fir, 52 ins. diam., bears S. 70° W., 11 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S1 BT on bark blaze.

An uprooted fir, 60 ins. diam., marked T19S R9W S36 BT on bark blaze, the stump hole of which bears N. 35° W., 30 lks. dist.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees,

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 7° W., 86 lks. dist., marked T19S R9W S36 CC BT.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 38° W., 42 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S1 CC BT.

From this point the ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 19 S., R. 8 W., bears N. 0° 04' W., 2.02 chs. dist.

Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, dogwood, and chinquapin. Undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, huckleberry, hazel, and salal.
