marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S22 BT.

Ascend 90 ft. over NE. slope, changing to N. slope.

6.00 Spur, slopes NW.; desc. 210 ft. over SW. slope.

11.90 Branch, 3 lks. wide, course N. 25° W.; asc. 90 ft. over NE. slope.

15.05 Spur, slopes N. 25° W.; desc. 340 ft. over SW. slope, changing to W. slope.

24.70 West Fork of Smith River, 70 lks. wide, course S. 15° E.; asc. 200 ft. over SE. slope, changing to S. slope.

25.70 Truck trail and telephone line, bear N. 15° E. and S. 30° W.

26.85 Preliminary center line of access road, bears N. and S.

36.40 Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 30 ft. along S. slope.

40.14 The cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21, and 22.

Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, and yew. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, evergreen huckleberry, salmonberry, arrowwood, rhododendron, red huckleberry, and salal.

N. 1° 25' E., bet. secs. 15 and 16.

Ascend 80 ft. over S. slope, changing to SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.80 Top of ascent on W. slope; desc. 100 ft. along W. slope.

16.50 Left bank of Crane Creek, 10 lks. wide, on bend from N. 10° W. to S. 10° W.; asc. 55 ft. along W. slope.

23.90 Shallow ravine, course SW.; asc. 30 ft. along W. slope.

27.60 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course S. 35° W.; asc. 230 ft. over S. slope, changing to SW. slope.

37.80 Top of ascent on W. slope; desc. 25 ft. over NW. slope.

38.90 Wet ravine, course S. 80° W.; asc. 60 ft. over SW. slope.

40.50 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 15 and 16, marked by the remains of a dead vine maple, 6 ins. diam., with illegible scribe marks visible on one side, from which the original bearing trees,

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 28° E., 15 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT on bark blaze.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 85 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 14 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT on bark blaze.
