

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 9 W.

The cor. of secs. 16 and 17, on the S. bdy. of sec. 9, marked by a cascara, 8 ins. diam., uprooted and lying beside corner point, with no marks remaining, from which

An uprooted fir, 44 ins. diam., is found lying 6 lks. S. of cor. point, point of origin not located, marked T20S R9W on bark blaze, evidently the SW. bearing tree marked by Thiel in 1891, reported dead by Mensch in 1921.

A cascara, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 6° W., 39 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks visible on nearly healed blaze. (A Mensch bearing tree.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees,

A fir, 55 ins. diam., bears S. 48° E., 143 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S16 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 63½° W., 79 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S17 BT.

Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, dogwood, cascara, yew, chinquapin, wild cherry, and madrona. Undergrowth, vine maple, evergreen and red huckleberry, salmonberry, hazel, rhododendron, arrowwood, manzanita, salal, and bracken.

From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.

N. 0° 07' E., bet. secs. 31 and 32.

Descend 51 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth, partly logged.

- 3.10 Buck Creek, 20 lks. wide, course NW.; asc. 260 ft. over SW. slope.
- 5.00 Barbed wire fence, bears E. and W.
- 5.10 Unimproved road, bears E. and W.
- 13.85 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 195 ft. over NW. slope.
- 18.90 Enter clearing; edge bears E. and W.
- 21.95 Tractor road, bears E. and W.
- 22.05 Olsen Bros. sawmill, bears S. 48° W.
- 23.50 Little Buck Creek, 10 lks. wide, course S. 60° W.; asc. 63 ft. over SE. slope.
- 31.50 Top of ascent on E. slope; desc. 7 ft. along E. slope.
- 31.65 Barbed wire fence, bears NW. and SE.
- 32.70 Barbed wire fence, bears E. and W. along edge of clearing; enter heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
