

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS	
71.00	Ravine, course S. 10° E.; asc. 210 ft. over SE. slope, changing to S. slope.
81.85	Spur ridge, bears N. and SE.; desc. 68 ft. over SW. slope.
84.02	The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30. Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, and maple. Undergrowth, vine maple, evergreen and red huckleberry, hazel, salmonberry, arrowwood, and salal.
	S. 82° 17' W., bet. secs. 19 and 30. Descend 150 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
3.80	Ravine, course S.; asc. 300 ft. over SE. slope.
10.00	Spur, slopes S. 10° E.; desc. 70 ft. over SW. slope.
13.50	Ravine, course S. 5° W.; asc. 100 ft. over SE. slope.
20.75	Spur, slopes S. 15° W.; desc. 400 ft. over W. slope.
29.45	Ravine, course S. 75° W.; desc. 300 ft. along S. slope, changing to SW. slope.
37.60	Branch, 10 lks. wide, course S. 5° W.; asc. 184 ft. over SE. slope.
41.62	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 30, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked $\begin{array}{r} \frac{1}{4} \text{ S } 19 \\ \frac{1}{4} \text{ S } 30 \\ 1953 \end{array}$ from which A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 43° W., 46 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S19 BT. A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 61° E., 23 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S30 BT. Ascend 200 ft. over SE. slope.
46.10	Spur, slopes S. 5° W.; desc. 450 ft. over broken W. slope.
55.70	Branch, 3 lks. wide, course S. 10° E.; asc. 440 ft. over E. slope, changing to SE. slope.
65.50	Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 160 ft. along broken S. slope, changing to SW. slope.
80.50	Dry bed of a stream, 2 lks. wide, course S. 15° E.; asc. 59 ft. over SE. slope.
83.24	The cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, on the W. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record. Land, mountainous and very rough. Soil, sandy loam, with many exposed sandstone ledges. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, and yew. Undergrowth, vine maple, evergreen huckleberry, salmonberry, hazel, rhododendron, arrowwood, and salal.
