

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 20 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS
85.96

The cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19, and 20, monumented with a sandstone, 24 x 18 x 6 ins., marked with a cross (X) on top, the other marks weathered away, firmly set 12 ins. in the ground, from which the original bearing trees:

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N. $62\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 18 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S17 BT on bark blaze. (Record distance, 14 lks.)

A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S. 62° E., 38 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S20 BT on bark blaze. (Record bearing, S. 58° E.)

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 62° W., 17 lks. dist., marked with illegible scribe marks on bark blaze. (Record distance, 16 lks.)

An uprooted fir, 36 ins. diam., with no marks remaining, the stump hole of which bears N. 89° W., 4 lks. dist. (Record distance, 40 lks.)

An iron pipe, 4 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., is found lying beside the marked stone, with iron pipe cap marked

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which a new bearing tree,

A fir, 45 ins. diam., bears N. 17° W., 105 lks. dist., marked T20S R9W S18 BT.

Reset the sandstone and the iron pipe alongside the iron post.

Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, and maple. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, salmon-berry, evergreen and red huckleberry, arrowwood, ceanothus, rhododendron, and salal.

From the cor. of secs. 16, 17, 20, and 21.

N. $88^{\circ} 01'$ W., bet. secs. 17 and 20.

Descend 20 ft. over W. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

0.40 Ravine, course N. 30° W.; asc. 50 ft. over NE. slope.

2.30 Spur, slopes N. 40° W.; desc. 95 ft. over NW. slope.

4.60 Intermittent branch, 3 lks. wide, course N. 15° W.; asc. 320 ft. over NE. slope.

11.25 Ridge, the divide bet. Coon Creek and Johnson Creek, bears N. 20° E. and S. 20° W.; desc. 300 ft. over NW. slope, changing to W. slope.

17.85 Ravine, course N. 40° W.; asc. 115 ft. over NE. slope.
