## General Description

The portion of township 26 south, range 7 west, covered by the resurvey is about 12 miles southeast of the town of Sutherlin, Oregon, and is almost entirely within a very extensive burn area at the head waters of Hubbard Creek. The area is drained in a northerly direction by Hubbard Creek and its tributaries. In the east half of section 21 is a high ridge, called Bear Ridge, which divides Hubbard Creek drainage from the main Umpqua River. Elevation above sea level range from about 1200 feet in Hubbard Creek to about 2,740 feet on Bear Ridge in section 21.

The area has been extensively burned and logged, and very little standing timber remains. A heavy undergrowth consisting of ceanothus, willow, madrone, manzanita, poison oak, salal, huckleberry, gooseberry, blackberry, chinquapin, and ocean spray has covered the burn area.

The ridges are steep with numerous outcroppings of sandstone bedrock and a number of small rock bluffs. Access is primarily by a graveled logging road along Hubbard Creek, with numerous logging roads radiating to the rest of the area.

There is no habitation or buildings within the sections covered and no evidence of mineral deposits was noted.

The average of a number of readings over all parts of the area covered by the resurvey gives a value of  $20^{\circ} 14'$  E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 43' in local attraction.
