Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the S. Bdy. of T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. $78\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ W., 35 lks. dist.,
marked T21S R8W S34 BT.

HEMLOCK - M.P. 8

Land, mountainous. Soil, heavy clay, loose sand, and sandstone. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, yew, madrona, dogwood, and alder. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, huckleberry, salal, bracken, and poison oak.

N. $89^\circ 29'$ W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 34.

Descend 139 ft. over broken SW. slope; through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

4.85 Branch, 5 lks. wide, course S.; asc. 124 ft. over NE. slope.

11.22 Point for the closing cor. of secs. 2 and 3, T. 22 S., R. 8 W., at the end of a line of old blazes from the south, as determined from the remaining evidence of the original bearing trees:

Stump hole, bears S. 35° E., 41 lks. dist.

A fir stump, 38 ins. diam., bears S. 30° W., 56 lks. dist., burnt.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 78° W., 82 lks. dist., marked T22S R8W S3 CC BT.

Ascend 199 ft. over NE. slope.

18.45 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course NE.; asc. 397 ft. over broken SE. slope.

38.77 Point for witness cor. to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 34 only.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

A fir, 34 ins. diam., bears N. 34° W., 56 lks. dist., marked WC $\frac{1}{4}$ S34 BT.

38.80 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 34 only, a fir, 25 ins. diam., with healed scars facing NE. and NW., from which the original bearing trees:
