

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

From the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19, and 24, on the E. bdy. of the Tp., heretofore described.

S. 85° 32' W., bet. secs. 13 and 24.

Ascend 100 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.10 Spur, slopes N. 20° E.; desc. 100 ft. over NW. slope.

6.75 Head of ravine, course N.; asc. 100 ft. over NE. slope.

10.00 Ridge, the divide bet. Smith River and Umpqua River, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 120 ft. along S. slope.

40.85 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 24, determined from the original bearing trees, as follows:

A dead and fallen hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 5° E., 14 lks. dist., with blaze healed. I open blaze and uncover scribe marks $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT on decayed face of blaze.

A cedar, 33 ins. diam., bears S. 18° W., 42 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks visible on charred face of blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees,

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 37° 45' E., 50 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S13 BT.

A cedar, 23 ins. diam., bears S. 34 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W., 22 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S24 BT.

N. 89° 55' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 60 ft. along broken S. slope.

7.30 Wet ravine, course S.; asc. 90 ft. over SE. slope.

11.45 Flat spur, slopes S. 20° E.; desc. 120 ft. over SW. slope, changing to S. slope.

14.60 Tractor trail, bears NW. and SE.

22.40 Spur, slopes S. 30° W.; tractor trail along spur, at edge of burned area, bears N. 30° E. and S. 30° W.; desc. 180 ft. over W. slope, through partially fire-killed heavy timber and burned undergrowth.

28.30 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course S. 40° W.; desc. 15 ft. along S. slope.

39.55 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course S.; continue along S. slope.

40.76 The cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24.

Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, dogwood, and yew. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, ceanothus, and salal.
