Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

From the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35, and 36.

N. 88° 23' W., bet. secs. 26 and 35.

Descend slightly, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 0.70 Ravine, drains S. 20° W.; asc. 8 ft. over broken S. slope.
- 12.30 Ridge, bears N. and SE.; also tractor trail, bears NE. and SE.; desc. 438 ft. over steep W. slope.
- 23.00 Ravine, drains SW.; desc. 90 ft. over SW. slope.
- 28.80 Spur, slopes S. 30° W.; desc. 117 ft. over steep NW. slope.
- 31.80 Ravine, drains S. 15° W.; desc. 23 ft. over SW. slope.
- 34.20 Branch, 6 lks. wide, course S. 30° E.; asc. 146 ft. over NE. slope.
- 36.78 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 35, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
- Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

- A hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 73° W., 61 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S26 BT.
- A cedar, 27 ins. diam., bears S. 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 6 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S35 BT.
- Ascend 157 ft. over steep NE. slope.
- 40.40 Spur, slopes NE.; asc. 105 ft. over NE. slope.
- 45.50 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 105 ft. over NW. slope.
- 50.40 Ravine, drains NE.; asc. 302 ft. over steep E. slope.
- 55.60 Spur, slopes NW.; desc. 198 ft. over steep NW. slope.
- 62.10 Ravine, drains NE.; asc. 256 ft. over steep NE. slope.
- 67.20 Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 34 ft. over NW. slope.
- 70.55 Ravine, drains NE.; asc. 170 ft. over steep, rocky E. slope.
- 73.56 The cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35.

Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay and sandstone. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, chinquapin, dogwood, and madrona. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, salal, ceanothus, arrowwood, bracken, and poison oak.

N. 89° 23' W., bet. secs. 27 and 34.

Ascend 169 ft. over steep NE. slope, through heavy timber, partly burned; undergrowth nearly all consumed.

- 4.00 Ridge, bears N. 30° W. and S. 30° E.; desc. 107 ft. over SW. slope.
