	A hemlock, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 34° E., 47 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S14 BT.
	Ascend 15 ft. along N. slope.
40.60	Spur, slopes N.; desc. 70 ft. over NW. slope.
42.30	Branch, 2 lks. wide, course N. 20° E.; asc. 60 ft. over broken NE. slope.
53.80	Bed of dry stream, course N. 80° E.; asc. 30 ft. along winding stream bed.
58.50	Leave stream bed, course E. from S. 80° W.; asc. 200 ft. over SE. slope, partly burned; indistinct edge, bears NW. and S.
67.15	Saddle of ridge, and unimproved fire road, bears N. and S.; desc. 400 ft. over W. slope.
76.00	Branch, 1 lk. wide, course NW.; asc. 10 ft. over NE. slope.
77.10	Point of spur, slopes N.; desc. 25 ft. over NW. slope.
77.75	Branch, 1 lk. wide, course N. 35° W.; asc. 130 ft. over NE. slope, changing to N. slope.
80.42	The cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14, and 15.
	Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, maple, alder, and chinquapin. Undergrowth, salmon-berry, vine maple, hazel, huckleberry, and salal.
	N. 86° 21' W., bet. secs. 10 and 15.
	Descend 80 ft. over NW. slope, through heavy timber and burned undergrowth.
2.05	Branch, 2 lks. wide, course NE.; asc. 270 ft. over steep E. slope.
8.35	Spur ridge, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.; desc. 210 ft. over SW. slope.
16.00	Branch, 2 lks. wide, course N. 60° W.; desc. 20 ft. along broken N. slope.
21.70	Spur, slopes N. 50° W.; desc. 260 ft. over SW. slope.
33.60	Branch, 3 lks. wide, course N. 70° W.; desc. 15 ft. along N. slope.
34.69	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 15, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
