CHAINS

A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears N. $6\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 110 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S10 BT.

A cedar, 13 ins. diam., bears S. $73\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 76 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S15 BT.

Descend 95 ft. along N. slope, changing to NW. slope.

39.80 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course N. 15° W.; asc. 190 ft. over broken NE. slope.

48.30 Spur ridge and edge of logged and burned area, bear N. 30° W. and S. 30° E.; desc. 220 ft. over W. slope.

62.20 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course N. 75° W.; desc. 20 ft. along N. slope.

64.20 Same branch, 1 lk. wide, course S. 70° W.; desc. 60 ft. along S. slope.

67.55 Small spur, slopes SW.; desc. 50 ft. over W. slope.

69.38 The cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15, and 16, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap marked

A sawed and partly burned fir stump, 47 ins. diam., bears S. 40° E., 30 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks visible on burned blaze. (Price B.T.)

A sawed and burned fir stump, 45 ins. diam., bears S. 2° W., 60 lks. dist., with blaze healed. (Price B.T.)

A burned maple stump, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 67° W., 27 lks. dist., with no marks remaining. (Wright B.T.)

A sawed and burned fir stump, 60 ins. diam., bears N. 45° W., 20 lks. dist., with no marks remaining. (Wright B.T.)

A sawed and burned fir stump, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 4° W., 243 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on burned blaze. (Price B.T.)

and reference monuments set in present resurvey,

An iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., set 28 ins. in the ground, for a reference monument, bears N. $22\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 20 lks. dist., with brass cap marked T21S R8W S10 RM 1954 and an arrow pointing to the corner.

An iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., set 28 ins. in the ground, for a reference monument, bears S. $22\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 20 lks. dist., with brass cap marked T21S R8W S16 RM 1954 and an arrow pointing to the corner.

Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy and rocky clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, and alder. Undergrowth, vine maple, huckleberry, salmonberry, hazel, and salal.
