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Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines of T. 21 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

Descend 255 ft. over steep N. slope, through heavy timber and burned undergrowth.

5.50 Dry bed of stream, 7 lks. wide, course N. 20° W.; at confluence of forks, each 4 lks wide, from S. 35° E. and S. 20° W.; asc. 175 ft. along W. slope.

23.00 Top of ascent on W. slope; desc. 25 ft. along W. slope.

25.00 Spur, slopes NW.; desc. 330 ft. over N. slope.

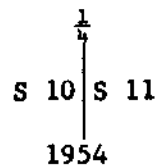
34.33 Gravelled road, 30 lks. wide, bears N. 47° E. and S. 58° W.; desc. 65 ft. over N. slope.

39.12 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 11, determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining original bearing tree, as follows:

A fir, 55 ins. diam., bears S. 68° W., 9 lks. dist., with the scribe marks BT visible on bark blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees,

A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 54° 45' E., 45 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S11 BT.

A cedar, 34 ins. diam., bears N. 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 74 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S10 BT.

N. 0° 05' E., beginning new measurement.

Descend 110 ft. over gentle N. slope, along W. edge of logged area.

19.04 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course N. 40° W.; asc. 20 ft. along W. slope.

21.65 Short spur, slopes NW.; desc. 45 ft. over N. slope.

23.60 Unimproved road, 40 lks. wide, bears N. 47° E. and S. 47° W.

24.92 Left bank of Smith River, course S. 47° W.

25.75 Right bank of Smith River; asc. 20 ft. over S. slope.

27.32 Gravelled road, 35 lks. wide, bears N. 47° E. and S. 47° W.; enter rock quarry.

30.14 Top edge of quarry, 75 ft. above road, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W.; asc. 45 ft. over broken SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

36.61 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course S. 60° E.; asc. 125 ft. over S. slope.

40.31 The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10, and 11, determined from the original bearing trees, as follows:

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 58° E., 24 lks. dist., with scribe marks T21S S2 visible on partly opened blaze.
