A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 7° 45' E., 41 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S3 BT.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 22 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W., 30 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S10 BT.

From this point a local monument, bears S. 38° E., 6 lks. dist., an iron pipe, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 10 ins. above ground, firmly set.

Ascend 62 ft. over gradual E. slope.

49.75 E. end of a long, narrow spur, from S. 85° W.; asc. 120 ft. along N. slope near top of spur, through dense evergreen huckleberry.

56.37 Damewood house, bears N. 1° E.; a frame cabin, bears N. 18° W.

64.05 Damewood house and frame cabin, both bear N. 40° 45' E.

67.15 Top of ascent on flat back of spur, slopes NW.; desc. 2 ft. over top of spur.

67.64 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9, and 10, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

Land, mountainous and rolling. Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, yew, and dogwood. Undergrowth, evergreen huckleberry, vine maple, hazel, salmonberry, poison oak and salal.

From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10, and 11.

N. 6° 54' E., bet. secs. 2 and 3.

Ascend 470 ft. over broken SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

19.00 Spur ridge, bears N. 25° W. and S. 25° E.; asc. 55 ft. over broken SE. slope.

23.25 Spur ridge, bears N. 20° W. and S. 10° W.; desc. 50 ft. over NE. slope.

26.70 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course S. 85° E.; asc. 240 ft. over SE. slope.

37.60 Spur ridge, bears N. 20° W. and S. 20° E.; asc. 10 ft. along steep E. slope.

40.96 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 3, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked
