Dependent Resurvey of Portion of S. Bdy. of Sec. 31, T. 24 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. $0^{\circ}45'$ E., 101 lks. dist., mkd. E 1/16 S31 BT.

A hemlock, 7 ins. diam., bears N. $73\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 140 lks. dist., mkd. E 1/16 S31 BT.

Descend 12 ft. over NW. slope.

20.02 Ravine, drains NW.; asc. 2 ft. over NE. slope.

21.42 Spur, slopes NW.; desc. 57 ft. over NW. slope.

25.00 Draw, drains N. 10° E.; asc. 9 ft. over NE. slope.

26.60 Spur ridge, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 261 ft. over SW. slope.

34.42 Abandoned logging road, bears N. 80° W. and S. 80° E.

35.40 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 20° W.; asc. 83 ft. over NE. slope.

38.28 Abandoned skid road, bears N. and S.

39.10 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31 only, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd.

from which original bearing tree:

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 40° E., 56 lks. dist., with a partially healed blaze, the scribe marks having been destroyed in 1944, by N. D. Price.

and bearing tree by Price, in 1944:

A cedar turnout, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 39° E., 20 lks. dist., with scribe marks $\frac{1}{4}$ S visible on partially healed blaze.

and bearing tree by County Surveyor in 1955:

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N. $84\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 85 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S31 T24S R3W BT.

and new bearing tree:

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. $65\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 41 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S31 BT.

From this point the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6 only, on the N. bdy. of T. 25 S., R. 3 W., bears N. $82^{\circ}23'$ W., 1.09 chs. dist., monumented by the County Surveyor, in 1955, with an iron post, 1 in. diam., 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd.
