Dependent Resurvey of the E. and N. Bdy. of Sec. 31, T. 24 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. $34\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 63 lks. dist., with scribe marks 24S R3W S29 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears S. $82\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 45 lks. dist., with scribe marks S32 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears South, $20\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with scribe marks T24S R3W CS BT visible on open blaze.

A cedar, 9 ins. diam., bears S. $78\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 54 lks. dist., with scribe marks T24S R3W S31 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

and new bearing tree:

A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears N. $72\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., $49\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., mkd. T24S R3W S30 BT.

Reset county surveyor's post alongside the iron post.

Land, mountainous, except for bottom land extending 10 chs. N. and 5 chs. S. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. Soil, clay loam, loam and rocky. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, dogwood and cascara; undergrowth, vine maple, fern, arrowwood, hazel, reproduction and blackberry.

S. $88^{\circ}39'$ W., bet. secs. 30 and 31.

Ascend 303 ft. over E. slope, changing to NE. slope, through heavy timber and light undergrowth.

15.55 Spur, slopes SE.; desc. 126 ft. over NW. slope.

19.79 Point for the E $\frac{1}{16}$ sec. cor. of secs. 30 and 31.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 34 lks. dist., mkd. E $\frac{1}{16}$ S31 BT.

Descend 461 ft. over NW. slope.

34.56 Maintained, gravel surfaced access road, bears SE. and NW. on curve toward NE.

38.24 Jeffers Creek, 3 lks. wide, course S. curving SE.; asc. 62 ft. over E. slope, changing to NE. slope.
