A hemlock, 7 ins. diam., bears S.  $48\frac{1}{2}^\circ$  W., 36 lks. dist., mkd. T24S R8W S30 BT.

A hemlock, 13 ins. diam., bears N.  $37^\circ$  W., 49 lks. dist., mkd. T24S R8W S19 BT.

The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 20, determined at record bearing and distance from the original SE. bearing tree:

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.  $85^\circ$  E., 16 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on partially opened blaze.

and a bearing tree which does not match the record

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.  $53\frac{1}{4}^\circ$  W., 28 lks. dist., with scribe marks 4 S B visible on opened blaze. (Record, S.  $58^\circ$  W., 31 lks.)

General Description

The lines resurveyed are located about three miles west of Tye, Oregon, in a mountainous area drained by Case Knife Creek and its tributaries, which run in a northeasterly direction through section 34 and into the Umpqua River. Elevations range from 550 feet above sea level along Case Knife Creek to 1,350 feet above sea level in the southwest quarter of section 34. Access into the area is by logging roads from Tye, which follow the summit of Case Knife Ridge along the south boundary of section 34, which has been clear cut and burned. The balance of the area is heavily timbered with the predominant species consisting of fir, hemlock, cedar and madrone and an undergrowth of Oregon grape, salal, ocean spray, poison oak and vine maple.
