Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy loam, rock outcrops. Timber, fir, hemlock and cedar; undergrowth, salal, vine maple, madrone, alder and arrowwood.

General Description

The area covered by this resurvey is about ten miles southwest of Yoncalla, Oregon, and is drained by the Umpqua River, Yellow Creek and their tributaries. Elevations above sea level range from about 1,280 feet to about 1,840 feet on a spur of Renhaven Ridge.

The soil consists of clay loam and sandy loam with numerous rock outcrops supporting heavy stands of fir, cedar and hemlock in those area which have not been logged. The predominant undergrowth is salal, vine maple, poison oak, hazel, alder, madrone and arrowwood.

There is no habitation or buildings within the area and no evidence of mineral deposits was noted.

An unimproved, dry weather road, terminates at the corner of sections 35 and 36 and runs in a southwesterly direction to connect with the road paralleling the Umpqua River.

The mean magnetic declination over the lines run in this resurvey is 20° E.
