

Dependent Resurvey of the Subdivisional Lines, T. 23 S., R. 6 W.

CHAINS 51.04	Spur ridge, bears N. 80° W. and S. 80° E.; trail, bears S. 80° E. and N. 80° W.; desc. 4 ft. over NW. slope.
51.61	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 5, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. <div style="text-align: center;"> T23SR6W ↓ S5 S4 ↓ 1957 </div> from which A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 10° E., 49 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S4 BT. A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 75° W., 50 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S5 BT. Descend 237 ft. over NW. slope.
57.64	Head of ravine, drains N. 70° W.; asc. 99 ft. over SW. slope.
64.64	Spur ridge, bears S. 60° E. and N. 60° W.; desc. 300 ft. over NE. slope.
70.54	Ravine, drains N. 75° W.; asc. 265 ft. over SW. slope.
83.15	Spur ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 211 ft. over NW. slope.
88.64	Ravine, drains W.; asc. 284 ft. over SW. slope.
104.64	The standard cor. of secs. 4 and 5, on the N. bdy. of the Tp. Land, mountainous. Soil, clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, and cedar. Undergrowth, salal, vine maple, poison oak, and madrone.
	From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, on the S. bdy. of the Tp. N. 11°06' E., bet. secs. 31 and 32. Descend 278 ft. over S. slope.
6.80	Gully, drains E.; asc. 88 ft. over S. slope.
9.80	Spur, slopes E.; desc. 339 ft. over N. slope.
10.70	Gully, drains E.; asc. 275 ft. over S. slope.
17.60	Spur, slopes E.; desc. 420 ft. over N. slope.
26.20	Creek, 5 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 378 ft. over S. slope.
37.08	Spur, slopes E.; desc. 123 ft. over N. slope.
40.07	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 32, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.
