	From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7, and 8.
	N. 2°29' W., bet. secs. 5 and 6.
	Ascend 217 ft. over S. slope, changing to SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
29.50	Ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 8 ft. over NW. slope.
33.50	Foot of descent, slopes W.; asc. 96 ft. over SW. slope.
38.63	Top of ascent, slopes W.; desc. 38 ft. over NW. slope.
46.135	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

	A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 41° E., 16 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S5 BT.
	A fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 60° W., 27 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S6 BT.
	Descend 67 ft. along W. slope.
50.14	From this point a point determined at the intersection of the bearings from the faces of four bearing trees, of which I have no record, bears East, 1 lk. dist., from which:
	A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 42° E., $13\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with scribe marks R2W S32 visible on a partially opened blaze. By counting the annual growth rings, the age of the scribe marks were determined to be about 70 years old.
	A hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 46° E., $30\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with scribe marks R2W S5 visible on a partially opened blaze. By counting the annual growth rings, the age of the scribe marks were determined to be about 70 years old.
	A fir, 72 ins. diam., bears S. 51° W., 11 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on a partially opened blaze. By counting the annual growth rings, the age of the scribe marks were determined to be about 55 years old.
	A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 46° W., 38 lks. dist., with scribe marks R2W S31 visible on a partially opened blaze. By counting the annual growth rings, the age of the scribe marks were determined to be about 55 years old.
71.27	Hill Creek, 2 lks. wide, course NW.; asc. 360 ft. over SW. slope.
78.40	Spur, slopes W.; desc. 75 ft. over NW. slope.
89.75	Spur ridge, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 202 ft. over NE. slope.
91.83	The cor. of secs. 5 and 6 only, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., previously described.
