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Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines, T. 21 S., R. 11 W.

CHAINS Ascend 225 ft. over S. slope.
 23.15 Ridge, divide between Otter Creek and Brainard Creek, bears N. 80° E. and S. 80° W.; desc. 244 ft. over N slope changing to NW slope.
 32.10 Ravine, course N. 55° W.; asc. 77 ft. over SW. slope.
 37.90 Spur, slopes N. 40° W.; desc. 181 ft. over NW. slope.
 38.90 Ravine, course S. 30° W.; asc. 50 ft. over SE. slope.
 39.90 Point for the cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22, and 23, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 53 ins. diam., bears N. 47° E., 77 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R11W S14 BT.

A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 62° E., 31 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R11W S23 BT.

A cedar, 38 ins. diam. bears S. 82° W., 59 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R11W S22 BT.

A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears N. 14° W., 21 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R11W S15 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, alder, maple, chinquapin, and yew; undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, arrowwood, hazel, salal, young timber, red huckleberry, coast huckleberry, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly supported in a mound of stone, 6 ft. base, 28 ins. high, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.

N. 87° 19' W., bet. secs. 14 and 23.

Ascend 245 ft. over SE. slope through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

 12.45 Ravine, course S. 55° W., desc. 50 ft. along S. slope.
 14.80 Spur, slopes SW.; desc. 177 ft. over W. slope.
 18.40 Ravine, course S. 30° W.; asc. 41 ft. over SE. slope.
 21.90 Top of ascent, slopes S.; desc. 60 ft. over SW. slope.
 23.50 Ravine, course S.; asc. 173 ft. over SE. slope.
 28.30 Top of ascent, slopes S.; desc. 310 ft. over SW. slope, changing to W. slope.
