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Subdivision of Section 22.

CHAINS

Corner falls at S. edge of a branch, 1 lk. wide, course N. 60° W.; asc. 297 ft. over S. slope, changing to SW. slope.

33.15 Spur, slopes NW.; desc. 311 ft. over broken N. slope, changing to broken NW. slope.

38.64 The W 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 15 and 22.

From the center N 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 22.

S. 89° 55' W., on the E. and W. center line of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 22.

Descend 75 ft. over broken NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

4.35 Ravine, course N. 50° E.; asc. 228 ft. over E. slope.

9.35 Spur, slopes N. 15° E.; desc. 336 ft. over general SW. slope.

18.60 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course N. 60° W.; across level land.

19.88 The NW 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 22. Descend 42 ft. over general W. slope.

20.30 Ravine, course N. 10° W.; asc. 119 ft. over NE. slope.

25.10 Spur, slopes N. 10° E.; desc. 132 ft. over broken NW. slope.

28.40 Ravine, course N. 65° E.; asc. 220 ft. over SE. slope.

34.45 Spur, slopes N. 35° E.; desc. 136 ft. over NW. slope.

36.40 Ravine, course N. 10° E.; asc. 68 ft. over NE. slope.

39.77 The N 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 22.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Section 22, T. 21 S., R. 11 W., is located about five miles northeasterly from Reedsport, Oregon. The section lies astride the ridge dividing Brainard Creek and Otter Creek, which are tributaries of Smith River. Both streams drain in a westerly direction to the river. Access into the section is by way of a private gravel and dirt road extending up Otter Creek from the end of the County Road which terminates at the line between sections 20 and 21 and a private gravel and dirt road extending up Brainard Creek from the County Road on the south side of Smith River. The elevation in section 22, ranges from about 80 feet above sea level in the Otter Creek bottom on the south boundary of the section to about 800 feet above sea level near the center of the section.

Soil in the section is composed of a sandy clay loam from a few inches to several feet in depth overlying sandstone bedrock, which is exposed in a number of outcrops and ledges throughout the section.

Timber in the section consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin, willow, madrone and yew; with undergrowth of vine maple, hazel, arrowweed, salmonberry, coast huckleberry, red huckleberry, ceanothus, salal, blackberry, and fern. The marketable timber on the privately owned lands in the section has, to a large extent, been logged off. The only improvement noted in the section is a dirt access road across the southwest corner. A wood frame farm house & a large stock barn are located about five chains southwesterly from the corner of sections 21, 22, 27, and 28.

No evidence of mineral was noted in the section

A large number of readings throughout the section gives a mean magnetic declination of 19° 48' E., with difference of 0° 34' in local attraction.
