

# County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivision, T. 19 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

- 21.10 Top of spur, slopes NE.; ascend 27 ft. along N. slope.
  - 30.90 Top of ridge, bears N. 10° W. and S. 70° E.; descend 345 ft. over steep W. slope, changing to NW.
  - 40.40 The corner of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17.
- Land, mountainous, across the canyon of Esmond Creek.  
 Soil, rocky clay.  
 Timber, heavy fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinquapin, dogwood, yew, and madrona.  
 Undergrowth, dense vine maple, hazel, salal, rhododendron, huckleberry, salmonberry, bracken, and Oregon grape.

N. 0° 3' E., between secs. 8 and 9.

Over mountainous land; through heavy timber and dense undergrowth; descend 85 ft. over NW. slope.

- 1.60 Bottom of ravine, drains W.; ascend 160 ft. over SW. slope.
- 8.80 Top of spur, slopes W.; descend 187 ft. over steep NW. slope.
- 13.20 Bottom of ravine, course W.; ascend 165 ft. over steep SW. slope.
- 18.20 Top of spur, slopes W.; descend 81 ft. over broken NW. slope.
- 19.50 Bottom of dry ravine, drains W.; ascend 286 ft. over broken SW. slope.
- 27.25 Top of spur, slopes SW.; descend 113 ft. over NW. slope.
- 34.20 Bottom of dry ravine, drains S. 60° W.; ascend 291 ft. over SW. slope, changing to S.
- 40.84 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 8 and 9 as determined from the remains of the original bearing tree in the NW. quadrant:

A burned fir stump, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 40 lks. dist., scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$  S BT on SE. face.

A burned fir stump, 46 ins. diam., bears N. 67 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 152 lks. dist. no marks or blaze distinguishable, possibly an Orig. BT.

At the corner point

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 39 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 9 BT.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 72° W., 10 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 8 BT.
