

# County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivision, T. 19 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

- 8.20 A fir, 12 ins. diam.
- 15.93 A fir, 25 ins. diam.
- 17.30 Descend 16 ft. into channel of Siuslaw River.
- 19.00 Right bank of Siuslaw River, course NE.
- 19.75 Left bank of Siuslaw River; ascend 15 ft.
- 20.30 Over nearly level bottom land.
- 21.60 Ascend 125 ft. over steep SE. slope.
- 25.60 Top of spur, slopes SE.; descend 100 ft. over steep SW. slope.
- 28.20 A spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE.; ascend 381 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 39.68 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 9, determined from the original bearing trees:
  - A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 57° W., 16 lks. dist., with nearly healed blaze facing SE. (Record bearing, N. 61 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W.)
  - A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 57° E., 13 lks. dist. with nearly healed blaze facing NW. (Record bearing, N. 61 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

  - A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 9° E., 47 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S4 BT.
  - A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 60° W., 20 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S9 BT.

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N. 88° 53' W., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 68 ft.

- 1.00 Top of high spur, slopes S. 80° E. from W.; thence along top of spur.
- 8.20 Leave spur, from S. 80° W.; ascend 214 ft. over NE. slope.
- 18.80 Descend 95 ft. along broken N. slope.
- 24.00 A dry draw, drains N. 60° E.; ascend 180 ft. along broken NE. slope.
- 29.50 Top of high spur, slopes S. 70° E.; descend 146 ft. over S. slope, to sec. cor.
- 34.20 Top of low spur, slopes SW.; slope changes to SW.
- 40.01 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9.

Land, mountainous.  
 Soil, rocky clay.  
 Timber, heavy fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, dogwood, chinquapin, and madrona.  
 Undergrowth, dense vine maple, hazel, salal, rhododendron, manzanita, slickleaf, and bracken.
