A white fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N.  $66\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E.,  $97\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist., mkd. T21S R4W S26 BT.

A chinquapin, 5 ins. diam., bears N.  $21\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  W., 55 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R4W S27 BT.

Reset the firs stake alongside the iron post.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, chinquapin, and madrone.

Undergrowth, reproduction, salal, and vine maple.

### General Description

The lines resurveyed are located about six miles south of Cottage Grove, Oregon, on the main ridge between United States Highway No. 99 and Cottage Grove Reservoir. Elevation ranges from 1200 feet to 1900 feet above sea level. The soil is a rocky clay loam covered by timber, consisting of fir, hemlock, madrone, chinquapin, alder, and maple. This mountainous area is unfit for cultivation and logging is the only activity carried on at the present time. Undergrowth consists of fir and hemlock reproduction, salal, vine maple, and poison oak.

The mail access to the area is by an improved county and private access road up Cedar Creek from the Coast Fork of the Willamette River. From this road one unimproved jeep trail crosses the area.

No mineral deposits were noted along the lines surveyed except for Geodes along the north face of a cliff on the line between sections 25 and 26.

The average of a number of readings along the lines resurveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of  $21^{\circ} 01' E.$  There is a range of  $1^{\circ} 48'$  in local attraction.
