

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

CHAINS

A fir, 54 ins. diam., bears N. 77° E., 15 lks. dist., with the scribe mark 5 visible on the face of the partially opened blaze.

A fir, 52 ins. diam., bears S. 74° E., 57 lks. dist., plainly blazed and healed. (Record, S. 16° E., the complement of the actual angle.)

and a bearing tree marked by the county surveyor.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 8° W., 36 lks. dist., marked CS T2OS R7W S2 CC BT.

20.60 A ravine, course W. from SE.; desc. 130 ft. along ravine.

25.86 Leave ravine, course S. 70° W.; asc. 15 ft. over SE. slope.

29.70 Top of ascent on S. slope; desc. 135 ft. over SW. slope.

39.02 Haight Creek, 8 lks. wide, course N. from S. 80° W.; asc. 110 ft. over E. slope, changing to NE. slope.

39.33 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 35 at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

40.45 A telephone line, bears N. and S.

40.57 A dirt road, bears N. and S.

43.64 Top of ascent on N. slope; desc. 5 ft. over NW. slope.

46.81 A ravine, course N.; asc. 155 ft. over E. slope.

53.75 A spur, slopes N. 30° E.; desc. 70 ft. over NW. slope.

56.60 A ravine, course N.; asc. 155 ft. over E. slope.

60.05 A ridge, bears N. and S.; desc. 345 ft. over W. slope, changing to SW. slope.

68.45 A ravine, course NW.; desc. 12 ft. along S. bank of ravine.

69.46 The dry bed of a stream, 4 lks. wide, course N. 15° W.; asc. 95 ft. over NE. slope.

72.95 A spur, slopes N.; desc. 43 ft. over NW. slope.

74.45 A ravine, course N. 20° E.; asc. 107 ft. over NE. slope.

77.25 A spur, slopes N.; desc. 55 ft. over NW. slope.

78.55 The cor. of secs. 34 and 35, determined at the record bearing from the original SE. bearing tree and the record bearing and distance from the original NW. bearing tree as follows:
