A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S. $10\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 39 lks. dist.,
mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S13 BT.

Descend 70 ft. over SE. slope.

- 49.70 Whittaker Creek, 11 lks. wide, course NE.; desc. 30 ft. along broken N. slope.
- 64.10 Branch, 10 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 250 ft. along broken N. slope.
- 76.90 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course N. 15° E.; asc. 65 ft. along broken N. slope.
- 82.80 Ravine, course N.; asc. 165 ft. along broken N. slope.
- 94.10 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 65 ft. over E. slope.
- 96.10 Branch, 10 lks. wide, course N. 40° E.; thence across bottom land.
- 97.40 Branch, 8 lks. wide, course N. 20° W.; asc. 10 ft. over W. slope.
- 98.48 The closing cor. of secs. 12 and 13.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, dogwood, cascara, madrona, and yew.

Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, salal, red huckleberry, evergreen huckleberry, salmonberry, and sword fern.

From the cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13, and 14.

N. $0^{\circ} 05'$ E., bet. secs. 11 and 12.

Ascend 40 ft. over SW. slope.

- 1.50 Logging road, 40 lks. wide, gravelled and maintained, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.
- 8.50 Ridge, the divide between North Fork of Smith River and Whittaker Creek, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.; desc. 60 ft. over NE. slope.
- 15.30 Spur, slopes N. 80° E.; desc. 175 ft. over NE. slope.
- 18.80 Head of ravine, course E.; desc. 20 ft. over NE. slope.
- 24.10 Spur, slopes N. 60° E.; desc. 90 ft. over NE. slope.
- 28.60 Head of ravine, course E.; asc. 75 ft. over SE. slope.
- 31.20 Spur, slopes N. 80° E.; desc. 235 ft. over N. slope.
- 35.60 Ravine, course NE.; asc. 130 ft. over SW. slope.
- 40.60 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 12, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
