Dependent Resurvey of Portion of Subdivisional Lines of T. 19 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. $45\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 32 lks. dist.,
mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S2 BT.

Descend 320 ft. over NE. slope.

49.85 Ravine, course N. 40° E.; desc. 8 ft. along E. slope.

57.30 Ravine, course S. 50° E.; asc. 67 ft. over SE. slope.

58.75 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 80° E. and S. 80° W.

59.54 Intersect the Fourth Standard Parallel South.

Point for the closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, on the S. bdy. of
sec. 36, T. 18 S., R. 9 W., at proportionate distance; there is
no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 36 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground,
with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 84° E., 26 lks. dist.,
mkd. T19S R9W S1 CC BT.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 59° W., 52 lks. dist.,
mkd. T19S R9W S2 CC BT.

From this point the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S.
bdy. of T. 18 S., R. 9 W., bears S. $89^{\circ} 48'$ W., 12.90 chs. dist.
The iron post has been removed by a slide.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 36 ins. long., 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground,
with brass cap mkd.

from which the bearing trees mkd. by N. D. Price in 1929:

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 54° E., 31 lks. dist.,
blazed and healed.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 36° W., 22 lks. dist.,
blazed and healed.

From the same point, the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 18 S.,
R. 9 W., bears N. $89^{\circ} 48'$ E., 26.33 chs. dist., monumented with an
iron post, 1 in. diam., 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, mkd. and
witnessed as described in the official record.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, chinouapin, dogwood and
madrona.

Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, salal, red huckleberry,
evergreen huckleberry, salmonberry, and sword fern.
