A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 56° E., 118 lks. dist., mkd. T19S R9W S6 CC BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 88½° E., 99 lks. dist., mkd. T19S R9W S7 CC BT.

Land, mountainous.
 Soil, sandy clay loam.
 Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, chinquapin, dogwood and madrona.
 Undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, arrowwood, salal, red huckleberry, evergreen huckleberry, hazel, rhododendron, and sword fern.

From the corner of secs. 5, 6, 7, and 8.

N. 0° 49' E., bet. secs. 5 and 6.

Thence across nearly level river bottom land, through light undergrowth.

- 4.00 Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 10° E., and S. 10° W.
- 4.50 North Fork of Smith River, 50 lks. wide, course W.; continue across bottom land.
- 15.20 Dirt road, 25 lks. wide, bears N. 70° W. and S. 70° E.
- 21.00 Leave bottom land and enter timber, edge bears NW. and SE.; ascend 450 ft. over broken SW. slope.
- 39.06 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, determined at record bearing and distance from the remains of each of the original bearing trees:

A fir snag, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 61° E., 40 lks. dist., badly decayed, with no marks remaining on old blaze.

A fir snag, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 66° W., 93 lks. dist., badly decayed, with no marks remaining on old blaze.
