

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines, T. 23 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

T 23 S R 7 W
 S 21 | S 22
 S 28 | S 27
 1961

from which

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 52° E., $18\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist.,
 mkd. T23S R7W S22 BT.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 86° E., 67 lks. dist.,
 mkd. T23S R7W S27 BT.

Deposit the original post alongside the iron post.

From this point the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 22 and 27, bears S.
 S. $89^{\circ} 23'$ E., 39.31 chs. distance, previously described.

There is no remaining evidence of any of the original meander
 corners which were established on this mile of line.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, oak, chinquapin, & madrone.

Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, blackberry, salmonberry,
 huckleberry, willow, salal, poison oak, and fern.

Subdivision of Section 35, T. 23 S., R. 7 W.

The following subdivision of section was executed in conformity
 with legal surveying practice. The record of true line notes
 only, is set forth in the following field notes.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 35 only, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.

N. $1^{\circ} 57'$ W., along the N. and S. center line of sec. 35.

Descend 43 ft. over NW. slope, through heavy timber and dense
 undergrowth.

2.40 Branch, 4 lks. wide, course W.; asc. 5 ft. along broken W. slope.

8.40 Branch, 6 lks. wide, course SW.; asc. 1,081 ft. over general
 S. slope.

36.10 Leave timber, enter logged area, edge bears E. and W.

37.15 Spur, slopes SW.; desc. 45 ft. over NW. slope.

39.42 Point for the center $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 35, at intersection with
 the E. and W. center line.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 25 ins. in the
 ground, with brass cap mkd.

A white fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. $61\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 183 lks.
 dist., mkd. C $\frac{1}{4}$ S35 BT.

A white fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. $26\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 106 lks.
 dist., mkd. C $\frac{1}{4}$ S35 BT.

Descend 6 ft. over NW. slope.
