CHAINS

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 65° E., 32 lks. dist., mkd. T24S R1W S8 BT.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 31° W., 30 lks. dist., mkd. T24S R1W S7 BT.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 64° W., 20 lks. dist., mkd. T24S R1W S6 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam, and rocky.

Timber, fir, cedar, pine, chinquapin, yew, hemlock, white fir, and alder; undergrowth, hazel, vine maple, rhododendron, salal, and Oregon grape.

General Description

The portion of township 24 south, range 1 west, which was resurveyed lies about 28 miles southeasterly of the town of Cottage Grove, Oregon. The area is located in the western foothills of the Cascade mountains. Elevations range from about 3,360 feet above sea level near the southeast corner of section 5, to about 4,000 feet above sea level near the W 1/16 section corner of sections 5 and 8, which is on the ridge dividing Willamette River and Calapooya Creek drainages.

The soil consists of clay loam and rock, and supports a luxuriant growth of timber and undergrowth. The timber is predominately Douglas fir, with stands of cedar, white fir, hemlock, alder, maple, chinquapin, yew, and dogwood. The undergrowth consists of hazel, vine maple, salal, Oregon grape, and rhododendron.

The ridge dividing the Willamette River and the Calapooya Creek drainages bears N. 25° E., and S. 25° W. The area on the east side of the ridge is rained by numerous small creeks flowing in a southeasterly direction and on the west side by a creek flowing in a northerly direction.

Access is gained by way of a newly constructed gravel surfaced access road, which branches from the County road along Sharps Creek.

There was no mineral deposits noted within the area.
