## General Description

The lands included in the notes of the foregoing survey are located on a ridge between the towns of Sutherlin and Oakland, Oregon. The area is drained by a number of small streams. Elevation ranges from about 480 feet above sea level at the northwest corner of section 9 to about 1,200 feet above sea level near the center of section 9.

Access is by way of a paved highway, which runs between Oakland and Sutherlin.

Soil in the area is composed of sandy clay loam, from a few inches to several feet in depth. The lands are forested with fir, oak, cedar, hemlock, madrone, pine, maple, and chinquapin timber; with undergrowth of poison oak, vine maple, blackberry, thimbleberry, wild rose, hazel, arrowwood, fir and oak reproduction, chinquapin, salal, fern, and marsh grass.

No evidence of mineral was noted in the area covered by the resurvey.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of  $20^{\circ} 12'$  E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of  $1^{\circ} 15'$  in local attraction.
