

Dependent Resurvey, Subdivsional Lines, T. 23 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

N. 0° 30' W., bet. secs. 21 and 22, on true line.

Ascend 241 ft. over general S. slope across brushy pasture land.

13.60 Ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 10 ft. along W. slope.

20.00 Woven wire fence, bears E. and W.

21.70 Spur, slopes N. 10° W.; desc. 287 ft. over NE. slope.

36.15 Ravine, drains E.; asc. 56 ft. over SE. slope.

39.50 Top of ascent, slopes E.; desc. 14 ft. along E. slope.

40.10 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 22, perpetuated in 1925 by W. H. Woods, Deputy County Surveyor, with a sandstone, 16 x 4 x 2 ins. firmly set, 10 ins. in the ground, marked with a cross (+) on top and $\frac{1}{4}$ on the E. face. In 1959, W.N. Haines, Registered Surveyor No. 239, set a 36 x 1 x 1 inch T-iron, 30 ins. in the ground alongside the sandstone, from which the remaining original bearing tree:

A sawed fir stump, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 12° E., 9 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on opened blaze. (This tree was re-marked in 1925 by W.H. Woods)

and a tree marked by Woods:

A madrone, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 45° W., 30 lks. dist., with decayed blaze. (This tree was re-marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT on the bark by W.N. Haines in 1959)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 14° E., 59 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S22 BT.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 23° W., 59 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S21 BT.

Deposit the sandstone and the T-iron alongside the iron post.

N. 2° 14' W., beginning new measurement.

Descend 78 ft. over NE. slope, through scattering timber and undergrowth.

2.44 The meander cor. of secs. 21 and 22, on the left side of the Umpqua River, monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described in the official record.
