Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 23 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

and S. 35° E.

12.25 An iron pipe, 3/4 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, set by F.E. Waggoner in 1955.

15.30 Left bank of the Umpqua River, course S. 35° E.

22.70 Right bank of the Umpqua River; asc. 79 ft. over general E. Slope, across open farm land.

41.87 The cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29, perpetuated by F.E. Waggoner in 1955, with a steel rod, 5/8 in. diam., 18 ins. long, firmly set 14 ins. in the ground, at record bearing and distance from the original NW. bearing tree, which has since been destroyed; from which the Waggoner bearing trees:

A white oak, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 88° E., 109 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partly healed blaze.

A white oak, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 11½° W., 16 lks. dist., with a healed double blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees

A double maple, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 85° E., 187 lks. dist., marked T23S R7W S21 BT.

A white oak, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 65½° W., 88 lks. dist., marked T23S R7W S29 BT.

Deposit steel rod alongside the iron post.

Land, mountainous east of Umpqua River and rolling to the west.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, chinquapin, oak, willow, ash, and madrone; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, salmonberry, salal, huckleberry, blackberry, poison oak, and fern.

N. 1° 19' E., bet. secs. 20 and 21.

Descend 65 ft. over general NE. slope, across open farm land.

19.40 Right bank of the Umpqua River, course S. 48° E.

27.40 Left bank of the Umpqua River; asc. 93 ft. along broken W. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

28.70 Maupin Road, 35 lks. wide, gravelled, bears N. 47° W. and S. 47° E.

32.40 Ravine, drains S. 25° E.; asc. 308 ft. over SE. slope.
