

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 31 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

A fir snag, 35 ins. diam., bears N. 45° E., 38 lks. dist., mkd. S, B and other illegible scribe marks on bark blaze. (Record bearing, N.50° E.)

A fir snag, 38 ins. diam., bears S. 74° E., 23 lks. dist., mkd. T31 R8 S1 on old bark blaze. (Record bearing, S. 65° E.)

A fir snag, 55 ins. diam., bears S. 10° W., 34 lks. dist., with no marks visible.

A cedar, 25 ins. diam., bears N. 75° W., 32 lks. dist., with a healed blaze. (Record bearing, N. 72° W.) Remarked T31S R8W S10 BT.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 25 ins. in the ground, and in mound of stone, 2½ ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 24° E., 23 lks. dist., mkd. T31S R8W S11 BT.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 36° E., 28 lks. dist., mkd. T31S R8W S14 BT.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 34° W., 34 lks. dist., mkd. T31S R8W S15 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, white fir, madrone, maple, chinquapin, pine, and cedar; undergrowth, reproduction, salal, Oregon grape, rhododendron, hazel, arrowwood, live oak, raspberry, poison oak, vine maple, and ferns.

N. 0° 07' E., bet. secs. 10 and 11.

Descend 280 ft. over NW. slope, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.

11.40 Creek, 6 lks. wide, course N. 35° E.; asc. 310 ft. over SE. slope.

15.45 End of dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 30° E.

38.00 Spur, slopes N. 70° E.; desc. 60 ft. over NE. slope.

40.21 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 11, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
