

Dependent Resurvey, Subdivisional Lines, T. 31 S., R. 8 W.

8.05	Creek, 4 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 310 ft. over broken NE. slope.
24.70	Spur, slopes N. 20° E.; desc. 75 ft. over NW slope.
29.50	Ravine, drains N. 10° E.; asc. 105 ft. over NE. slope.
32.30	Spur, sloes N. 40° E.; desc. 90 ft. over NW. slope.
36.10	Ravine, drains N. 20° E.; asc. 65 ft. over broken NE. slope.
38.59	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 15, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.  Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.  $\frac{1}{4} \frac{S 10}{S 15}$ T 31 S R 8 W 1961  from which  A hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 16° W., 44 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 10 BT.  A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 24° W., 59 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 15 BT.  Ascend 220 ft. over broken NE. slope.
49.50	Spur, slopes N. 30° E., asc. 270 ft. over NE. slope.
68.15	Ridge and trail, bears N. 50° W. and S. 40° E., asc. 25 ft. along S. slope.
71.75	Spur, slopes S.; desc. 175 ft. along broken S. slope.
77.18	The cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15, and 16  Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, hemlock, white fir, madrone, maple, chinquapin, pine, and cedar; undergrowth, young timber, salal, Oregon grape, rhododendron, hazel, arrowwood, live oak, fern, black raspberry, poison oak, vine maple, ferns and vines.
	N. 1° 38' E., bet. secs. 9 and 10.
	Ascend 335 ft. over S. slope, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.
9.40	Ridge and trail, bear NW. and SE.; asc. 125 ft. over NE. slope.
20.55	Spur, slopes E.; enter old logged area, edges bear N. and E.; desc. 470 ft. over broken NE. slope.
40.95	The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 9 and 10, determined at record distance from the original bearing trees: A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 72° E., 33 lks. dist. mkd. BT on old bark blaze. (Record bearing, N. 74° E.)
