

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Remonumentation of Certain Original Corner Points, T. 25 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

The cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24, perpetuated and recorded by V. W. Hosford in 1957, monumented with an iron pipe, 36 ins. long, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, 18 ins. in the ground, from which the original bearing tree:

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 12° W., 21 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

and bearing trees marked by Hosford

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 31° E., $38\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with a pitched over blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. $9\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ E., $21\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., with a pitched over blaze.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 52° W., 28 lks. dist., with a pitched over blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which a new bearing tree

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 57° E., 79 lks. dist., marked T25S ~~R2W~~ S13 BT.

Reset iron pipe alongside the iron post.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 24, monumented with a basalt stone, 16 x 12 x 10 ins., firmly set 11 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face, from which the original bearing trees:

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 25° W., 12 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partly opened blaze. (Record distance, 10 lks.)

A fir snag, 42 ins. diam., bears S. 58° E., 24 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record distance, 22 lks.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap marked

from which new bearing trees

A cedar, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 41° W., $18\frac{1}{2}$ lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S13 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. $48\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ W., 33 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S24 BT.

Deposit the original corner stone alongside the iron post.
