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Remonumentation of Certain Original Corner Points, T. 25 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked

from which a new bearing tree

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N. $49\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 20 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S20 BT.

Deposit the original corner stone alongside the iron post.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 30, monumented with a basalt stone, 16 x 10 x 8 ins., loosely set 10 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face, from which the original bearing trees:

A cedar, 27 ins. diam., bears N. 14° W., 27 lks. dist., with a healed blaze. (Record bearing, N. 14° E.)

A down, hemlock, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 38° W., 25 lks. dist., with scribe marks 4 S3 visible on opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 12 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, to top, with brass cap marked

from which a new bearing tree

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S. $44\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 29 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S30 BT.

Deposit the original corner stone alongside the iron post.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 20, monumented with a basalt stone, 18 x 7 x 7 ins., firmly set 11 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the W. face, from which the original bearing trees:

A hemlock, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 80° E., 27 lks. dist., with scribe marks $\frac{1}{4}$ S2 visible on opened blaze. (Record bearing and distance, S. 75° E., 26 lks.)

A hemlock, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 49° W., 40 lks. dist., with scribe marks $\frac{1}{4}$ 19 visible on partly healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap marked
